Police Services Questionnaire

1. Please confirm or correct the following (from your response to a questionnaire for a Mt. San Jacinto Community College District [MSJCCD] project in Menifee dated December 2015)
 - a. RCSD staff serving the five District facilities consists of four deputies on 2 shifts, Monday through Friday, with coverage from 0600 to 2400 hours. *This is correct.*
 - i. Two deputies per shift on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. *This is correct.*
 - ii. One deputy per shift on Mondays and Fridays. *This is correct.*
 - b. District Campus Safety staff assist RCDS deputies, enforce traffic and parking regulations, and patrol facilities. *This is correct.*
 - c. What additional RCSD staffing do you estimate would be needed to serve the proposed campus, which is estimated to have total (full-time and part-time) enrollment of 15,000 at Master Plan buildout? *Your estimates listed below in Section I are commensurate with our expectations for staffing level increase with the purposed changes.*
 - i. (our estimate is eight additional deputies based on:
 1. The proposed campus would have a buildout enrollment of approximately 10,000 full-time equivalent (FTE) students.
 2. Districtwide enrollment in Fall 2015 semester was 16,662 total students or 5,160 full-time-equivalent (FTE) students (California Community College Chancellor's Office. 2016, February 22. Data Mart. Students: Student Count. http://datamart.cccco.edu/Students/Student_Term_Annual_Count.aspx.)
 3. Thus, the current RCSD staffing ratio is 4 deputies per 5,160 FTE students, or 1 deputy per 1,290 FTE students.
 4. Staffing needed at the existing staffing ratio would be 10,000/1,290, or about eight deputies.

2. What mitigation measures, if any, would you recommend for the community college project?

With the purposed changes, the Mt. San Jacinto College would have a total of six campuses and eight sworn employees assigned to the contract. The addition of a contractually dedicated supervisor position would enable more direct supervision over the daily operation.
