**STAFF REPORT**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council introduce and approve first reading of an Ordinance entitled:

ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_  
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILDOMAR,  
CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SECTION 2.04.040 OF THE WILDOMAR MUNICIPAL  
CODE TO INCREASE THE CITY COUNCIL SALARY TO \$400.00 PER MONTH

**BACKGROUND:**

The Wildomar Municipal Code currently provides that each City Councilmember receive a salary of \$300.00 per month. This amount is derived from Government Code section 36516, which limits City Council salaries in general law cities of under 35,000 residents to \$300.00 per month.

However, recent data from the State Department of Finance (attached) indicates that Wildomar's population recently surpassed 35,000. Accordingly, the City Council is now eligible for an increased salary rate of up to \$400.00 per month. The attached ordinance proposes to amend Wildomar Municipal Code section 2.04.040 to increase Council salaries to \$400.00 per month.

Government Code section 36516.5 provides that increases in Councilmember compensation do not apply during a Councilmember's term of office. However, this prohibition does not prevent the increase of all members of a Council serving staggered terms whenever one or more members of the Council become eligible for a salary increase by virtue of beginning a new term of office.

As the City Council is aware, new terms of office for Districts 2 and 4 commence in December of this year. However, as currently drafted in the attached Ordinance, the increase to \$400 per month would not become operative until January 1, 2017.

**NEW STATE POPULATION REPORT:  
CALIFORNIA GREW BY 348,000 RESIDENTS IN 2015**

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

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**SACRAMENTO**— California's population grew by 0.9 percent in 2015, adding 348,000 residents to total 39,256,000 as of January 1, 2016, according to an annual population report released today by the Department of Finance.

The report shows preliminary January 2016 and revised January 2015 population data for California cities, counties, and the state. Highlights include:

- Growth was widely distributed among the state's geographical regions, with most cities and counties throughout the state experiencing increases in population. Many northern and eastern counties, however, saw decreases, continuing a near decade-long downward trend.
- San Joaquin County was the fastest growing county in the state (over 1.3 percent), closely followed by Yolo, Riverside, and Santa Clara counties all slightly below 1.3 percent.
- The City of Los Angeles, California's largest city, grew by more than 50,000 persons in 2015 to reach a population over four million (4,031,000) for the first time.
- California's statewide housing growth, as measured by net unit growth in completed housing units for 2015, was largely flat from the previous year. Although net units were down 3 percent (67,110 net housing units compared to 69,435 net units in 2014), wildfires accounted for most of the decline. The losses to fire were most significant in unincorporated portions of Lake County (1,531) and Calaveras County (549).
- Multi-family housing comprised more than 50 percent of all new units in 93 of the 482 cities in California. Statewide, multi-family units represent 54.2 percent of unit growth last year, continuing a four-year trend. Los Angeles led the state with 12,224 new multi-family units, followed by San Francisco (2,893), San Jose (2,024), and San Diego (1,746).
- Of 482 California cities, 437 had gains in population, 44 had reductions, and 1 experienced no change.
- The largest numeric increases, consistent with their higher population base, occurred in the state's largest cities. Besides Los Angeles (50,000), San Diego, California's second largest city with a population of 1,392,000 added over 12,000 persons during the year. San Jose, with a population of 1,042,000, also added over 12,000 persons, while San Francisco with a population of 867,000, added over 9,000 persons in 2015.
- The city with the largest population decline in percentage and number was Avenal in Kings County (-5 percent, 656 persons), which was a direct result of group quarter loss.

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Other highlights include:

Among cities with a population above 30,000, growth was distributed throughout California, with cities in the Inland Empire, San Joaquin Valley, South Bay Area and Orange County comprising the top ten. Porterville with 5.3-percent growth leads this group, based largely on annexation activity. The remaining cities range in growth from 3.8 percent (Eastvale) to 2.6 percent (Clovis).

Ranked by net housing gains, Los Angeles (12,492), San Francisco (2,848), San Diego (2,837), Irvine (2,255), and San Jose (2,172) added the most housing units in 2015.

Vernon in Los Angeles County had the largest percentage growth in California, increasing by 72.1 percent, resulting from a new housing development. The next four largest changes in percentage terms were Oroville (11.9 percent) and Biggs (7.2 percent) both in Butte County, Emeryville in Alameda County (6.9 percent), and Lathrop in San Joaquin County (6.3 percent). Biggs, Emeryville, and Lathrop all added a large number of residents from recent housing increases. The population growth in Oroville was primarily the result of annexation activity.

Group quarters, such as college dorms, prisons, and military barracks, comprise only 2 percent of California's population. Last year, group quarters decreased by 1 percent statewide due mostly to an 11.3-percent drop in county jail population. Prison declines caused some smaller cities, such as Avenal in Kings County, Tehachapi in Kern County, Susanville in Lassen County, Crescent City in Del Norte County, and California City in Kern County to experience significant proportional population losses in 2015. Other cities, such as Soledad in Monterey County, McFarland in Kern County, and Blythe in Riverside County experienced some of the largest proportional population gains in 2015 due to increases in local correctional facilities.

Background Information:

These population estimates are produced annually by the Department of Finance for use by local areas to calculate their annual appropriations limit. The State Controller's Office uses Finance's estimates to update their population figures for distribution of state subventions to cities and counties, and to comply with various state codes. Additionally, estimates are used for research and planning purposes by federal, state, and local agencies, the academic community, and the private sector.

Changes to the housing stock are used in the preparation of the annual city population estimates. Estimated occupancy of housing units and the number of persons per household further determine population levels. Changes in city housing stock result from new construction, demolitions, housing unit conversions, and annexations. The sub-county population estimates are then adjusted to be consistent with independently produced county estimates.
