Please allow this letter to serve as an addendum to the Phase I Cultural Resources Assessment conducted for the referenced project by this firm in October of 2014. At the request of Ms. Barbara Hale, a cultural resources field survey was conducted on November 1, 2014 along the western portion of Palomar Street, extending 300 feet south of the proposed driveway for The Sycamore Academy. The area included in the survey is shown on the Off-Site Street Improvement Plan and Profile for The Sycamore Academy in Figure 1, and in the photographs of Figure 2. All unpaved land was surveyed in a single transect, beginning at the northwestern corner of the required off-site roadway improvement area, and continuing in a southeasterly direction to the terminus of the off-site roadway improvement area. No cultural resources of prehistoric (i.e. Native American) or historical origin were observed within this area during the field survey.
